skill level: so easy a child
could do it. (no, really!)

Sinkin' cute! These slow-going stuffed sweeties are easy to make, and even easier to love. Scotty sports a mustache, and his missus wears a jaunty scarf. Make one or both! They're a great use for some of those smaller felt scraps, too. (And find a little one to sew with you. Annabel specializes in teaching kids ages 8-12 how to sew. All her projects are kid-friendly!)

overall materials:

- Felt for body and head: (2) 9" X 12" pieces
- Spiral design: (2) 3 1/2" squares
- Mustache: Small scrap of black or brown (optional)
- Beret: (2) 2 1/2" squares
- Embroidery floss for eyes and mouth
- Fiberfill for stuffing

cutting:

For body:

- Cut out (1) 10 1/4" X 2 1/2" strip and (1) 5" X 2" strip
- Cut out (2) Head/neck templates
- Cut out (2) Body Templates

For spiral:

- Using a contrasting color, cut (2) spiral designs.

For hat:

- Cut (2) 2 1/4" diameter circles. Find the center and cut a 3/8" circular hole in 1 piece. (This becomes the beret's bottom and fits onto the snail's head.)

For mustache:

- Cut (1) mustache from black or brown felt.

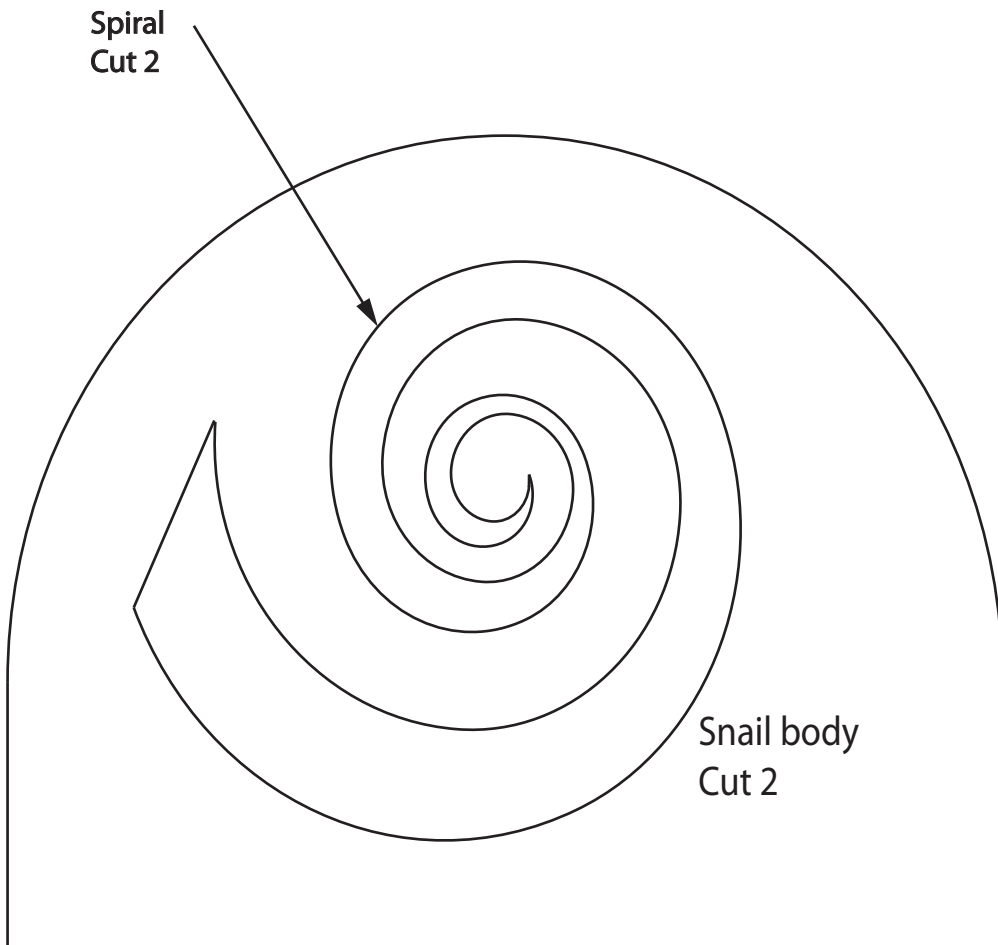
piecing:

1. Using head/neck pieces, sew RST. Clip inside corners and curves and turn RSO. Stuff with fiberfill. Embroider eyes, one on each side of head. Sew on mustache for Mr. McSnail.
2. Sew top and bottom of beret together. Turn RSO through beret's bottom hole. Set aside.
3. Sew spiral onto each side of snail with a topstitch or decorative stitch.
4. Sew each side to 5" X 2" bottom felt strip. Add 10 1/4" X 2 1/2" rectangle from bottom and around snail's shell leaving an opening for head/neck. Turn RSO and stuff with fiberfill. Close opening with head/neck piece.
5. Sew beret to top of head. Embroider mouth and nose. ★

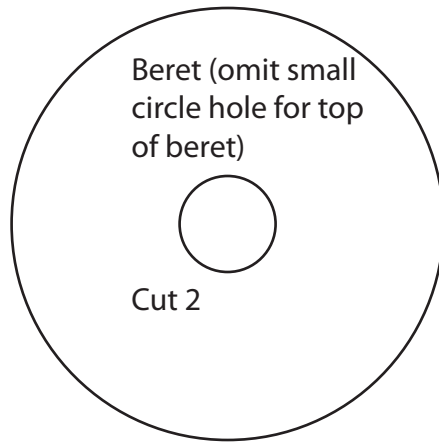
