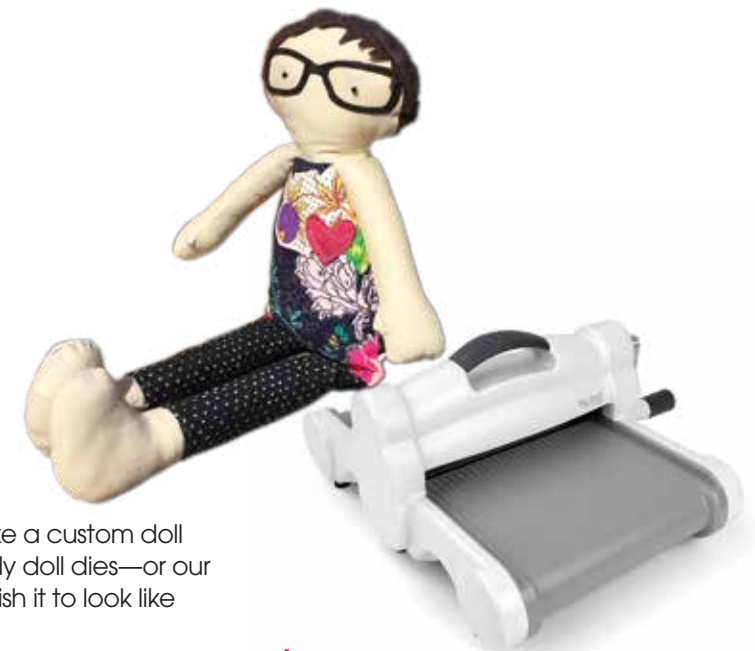

There's a boy doll die and a girl doll die, and each include shapes for making hair, clothing and accessories. The Kid Giddy dies work on the Big Shot, Fabi, Big Shot Plus and Big Shot Pro Sizzix die-cutting machines.
